hearing or trial in 2016

In Roanoke City (as is presently done in Roanoke County and Salem), all criminal cases will continue to be pre-set for trial as has been done in 2015. After cases are certified, attorneys are to contact one of the judicial assistants to pre-set their case for trial. (If the Grand Jury subsequently returns with "not a true bill", then it is a simple matter to cancel the matter that has already been set for trial.)

With civil cases, as is the ongoing practice, attorneys may continue to preset civil cases for trial by contacting any one of the judicial assistants.

Criminal cases (both "new" and "old") and civil cases that are not pre-set will be set at term of court on the first Monday monthly at 10:00 a.m.
