- Provides free, accurate legal information and advice to tenants facing eviction
- Serves tenants throughout Virginia
- Enables tenants to make better decisions, avoid eviction, and maintain stable housing

How do volunteer attorneys participate?

- Simply log onto the Helpline's case management system from home or office
- Select a case from those awaiting advice and review it
- Call and advise the client based on the Helpline's excellent training and reference materials

Helpline staff review all cases to ensure the advice was appropriate and handle all follow-up.

Who can volunteer?

- Attorneys licensed and in good standing with the Virginia State Bar, regardless of practice area
- Paralegals and other non-attorneys can help with intake

What is the commitment?

- Volunteer frequently or sporadically as you want
- Sign up for a flexible shift on our calendar
