



**RESOLUTION OF APPRECIATION  
MEMORIALIZING THE LATE CARROLL DANIEL REA**

WHEREAS Carroll D. Rea was born on October 23, 1921, in Greenwood, Virginia; and

WHEREAS Carroll died at his residence at The Hermitage in Roanoke, Virginia, on April 3, 2017, at the age of 95; and

WHEREAS Carroll was predeceased by the love of his life, his wife of 72 years Evelyn MacDonald Rea ("Evie"), only months before his own death, and is survived by his daughter, Pat Rea Sullivan, and her husband, Gary Sullivan, two grandchildren and two great-grandsons; and

WHEREAS Carroll grew up in Albemarle County and graduated from The Miller School in Crozet, which he later served as a member of its Board of Trustees; and

WHEREAS he was both a graduate of the University of Virginia and of its school of law where he earned the privilege of living on the lawn as a reward for academic distinction; and

WHEREAS, following brief military service during World War II, Carroll obtained employment with the Roanoke firm of Hazlegrove, Shackelford & Carr in 1945; and

WHEREAS he practiced law with distinction in the practice areas of real estate and civil trial practice as a partner with that firm through successive name changes and mergers for 44 years until his retirement from Woods, Rogers and Hazlegrove in 1989; and

WHEREAS he served as president of the Roanoke Bar Association in 1963-64, as a vice-president of the Virginia Bar Association, and as a substitute judge of the Roanoke City General District Court; and

WHEREAS Carroll D. Rea, throughout his life, pursued his love of scholarship through his reading and study of the history, literature and cultures of the world.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Roanoke Bar Association does hereby express its deepest sympathy to the family of Carroll D. Rea and recognizes his distinguished career and service to the Commonwealth of Virginia.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this resolution be furnished to the Circuit Courts of the City and County of Roanoke and the City of Salem and the United States District Court for the Western District of Virginia, Roanoke Division, with motions that the resolution be spread upon the common law order books of those courts; and that copies of this resolution be furnished to Carroll D. Rea's family to communicate the esteem in which the Roanoke Bar Association holds Carroll Daniel Rea and his memory and the Association's sorrow at his passing.
